Looking south-east along Stannage Edge.

A gentle and steady incline along good paths and tracks to reach the open moors and famous gritstone edge of Stannage, followed by an easy descent back into Hathersage.

1 START

Turn on to Baulk Lane from A6187, heading north. Follow track which turns into grassy path, leading through four gates and bypassing Brookfield Manor, L. Eventually reach gate and cross road – Birley Lane.

2 2.2km/1¼ miles

Pass through gate and field and through another gate into woods, beside small stream, then cross via wooden bridge. Head north-west, crossing wall via stone stile. Through another gate and field, over stile and continue up enclosed path to reach hole in wall. Turn L and walk between houses. Take R

turn on to path, through gate and climb uphill, crossing stile. Follow grassy path.

3 3.3km/2 miles

Cross wall via stone stile, located next to signpost for 'Longshaw Estate, Outseats', follow path north with wall L passing Dennis Knoll to reach road. Turn L heading west to sharp bend in road. Turn R and follow wide track north. After short distance cross large wooden stile, heading north for path beneath High Neb. (You may if you wish cut the walk short and stay on track to miss this section). Turn L taking path north-west beneath edge to grid ref SK225865.

4 6.4km/4 miles

Numerous tracks lead through boulders to gain top of edge. Turn R and head south, then south-east to reach trig point marking High Neb. Continue for 5.3km, crossing stile on ➤

ROUTE

Terrain Gradual incline through fields and moor on to gritstone edge; descent through moor and fields; all on well-marked paths and tracks

Suitable for Fit adults, older children, dogs on lead; good navigation required in poor weather

START/PARKING

Baulk Lane, off A6187, Hathersage, grid ref SK231815 (car park can be located in village centre)

COUNTRY WALKING



Trig point at the eastern end of Stannage Edge.

► way to reach a track at grid ref 250831, leading off edge prior to reaching trig point at eastern edge of Stannage. Continue south-east on moorland path to reach road.

5 12.1km/7½ miles

Cross road, and stile over wire fence, follow faint path south-

east to pick up wide grassy path. Turn R and head south-west downhill, crossing stile on way. On reaching junction of track, signposted 'Mitchell Field Farm', turn L and follow track through buildings. Immediately turn R on to grassy path through trees and cross wall via stile. Continue through field and cross another wall via stile and continue to reach gate.

6 14km/8¾ miles

Path goes through property and then electrically operated gate. Follow track and in short distance take path on R beside wall, south-west to cross stile with small plantation, R. Drop downhill through woods, passing through gate, on to lane to reach and cross A6187. Turn R and continue downhill back into Hathersage.
